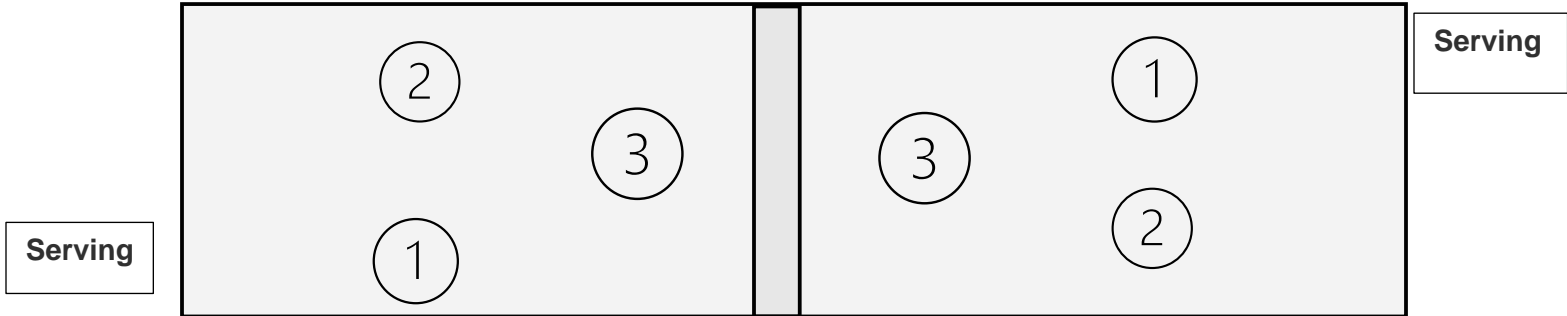


Beach 2024 12U Tripleball – May 25 Edmonton

Order of rotation is 1-2-3-1...



This format will be evaluated after the tournament and take into account feedback from participants

Serving and Right side position:1, Left side position: 2, Setter position: 3

Sequence 1

Ball 1 :Team A Serve (player 1)

Ball 2: Free Ball to Team B (player 1 on Rightside)

Ball 3: Free Ball to Team B (player 2 on Leftside)

Sequence 2 / Team B rotate (player 3 becomes server)

Ball 1: Team B Serve (player 1)

Ball 2: Free Ball to Team A (player 1 on Rightside)

Ball 3: Free Ball to Team A (player 2 on Leftside)

Sequence 3 / Team A rotate (player 3 becomes server)

Ball 1: Team A Serve (player 2)

Ball 2: Free Ball to Team B (player 1 on Rightside)

Ball 3: Free Ball to Team B (player 2 on Leftside)

Sequence 4 / Team B rotate (player 3 becomes server)

Ball 1: Team B Serve (player 2)

Ball 2: Free Ball to Team A (player 1 on Rightside)

Ball 3: Free Ball to Team A (player 2 on Leftside)

Sequence 5 / Team A rotate (player 3 becomes server)

Ball 1: Team A Serve (player 3)

Ball 2: Free Ball to Team B (player 1 on Rightside)

Ball 3: Free Ball to Team B (player 2 on Leftside)

Sequence 6 / Team B rotate (player 3 becomes server)

Ball 1: Team B Serve (player 3)

Ball 2: Free Ball to Team A (player 1 on Rightside)

Ball 3: Free Ball to Team A (player 2 on Leftside)

This format allows all athletes to sideout from both leftside and rightside as well as become the setter in position 3. This format also follows the following Volleyball Canada developmental rule:

“For VC 15U and younger competitions. After a team loses service, the last player to serve for that team, at the moment of service by the opposing team, must be positioned closer to the right sideline than their teammate. This requirement must be followed until that team regains the right to serve.”

Teams that are not playing will be the shagging team and the coach/chaperone will be the tosser. With free balls going to one side at a time the coach/chaperone will have enough time to switch sides of the court eliminating the need for a second tosser. Any tosses dramatically effected by wind will be ruled a re-toss up to 2.

If we can have 5/6 balls per court that should allow the sequences/games to go fairly quickly and get the young athletes to play best of three matches.

Teams would get a technical timeout at 24 points rather than 21 to keep in line with the number of balls in the sequences.

All teams will be Co-Ed with any combination of gender. Sets 1 & 2 will be played to 30 with teams switching every 12 points (4 sequences)! Set 3 if necessary, will be played to 15 points with teams switching every 12 points.
