Aimee Layzell and Sarah Thompson have set a new standard for excellence in youth beach volleyball in Alberta. As teammates on the 16U Team Alberta Beach program, their chemistry, focus, and drive led them to dominate the 2024 season - capturing multiple provincial and national titles.

Together, Aimee and Sarah won two VA Beach Tour Gold Medals, clinched 16U Youth Provincial Gold, and capped off their season with a national title, taking home 16U Youth Nationals Gold. Their consistency and composure in high-pressure moments reflected not just skill, but trust - in themselves, in their partnership, and in the process.

Known for their work ethic, leadership, and humility, Aimee and Sarah approached every tournament as an opportunity to grow. Mason also balances a strong indoor volleyball career while attending York University, showcasing his versatility and commitment to high-level performance across both disciplines of the game. Coaches praise Mason's technical ability, competitive mindset, and above all, his coachability - a quality that has made him not just a great athlete, but a great teammate.



Lifetime Achievement Award

Scott McLean

Scott McLean has spent more than four decades shaping the landscape of volleyball officiating in Alberta, Canada, and around the world. His career is marked by an unwavering commitment to integrity, mentorship, and excellence - not just on the court, but in every role he has taken on behind the scenes.

Scott began officiating internationally in 1997 and quickly established himself as a respected leader within NORCECA, Pan American, World League, and FIVB competitions. His ability to perform with professionalism and precision on some of volleyball's biggest stages earned him a reputation as one of Canada's most consistent and trusted referees.

But Scott's legacy goes far beyond the international court. From local matches in Alberta to national committee rooms, he has dedicated his life to developing others. As Chair of Volleyball Canada's National Referee Committee (2020-2023), Scott championed a new era of referee development -






one that prioritized mental performance, emotional regulation, and long-term mentorship systems. His contributions helped redefine what success and sustainability look like for officials across Canada.

In his many roles with Volleyball Alberta, Scott served as a coach, evaluator, clinician, and trusted mentor. His deep understanding of people and ability to navigate complex challenges made him a valued contributor to referee recruitment, retention, and education for decades.

The VC Lifetime Achievement Award is one of the highest honours Volleyball Canada can bestow - recognizing not only years of service, but deep and lasting influence on the sport. Scott's impact has elevated the standard of officiating across Canada and inspired generations of referees to lead with the same integrity, humility, and passion that have defined his career. Volleyball Canada is proud to recognize Scott McLean as the recipient of the 2025 Lifetime Achievement Award.



It started with a clipboard and a borrowed whistle - an invitation to stay involved in the game after injury ended his playing career. But what began as a temporary sideline would become a lifelong calling for Scott McLean, one of Canada's most accomplished and influential volleyball referees.

Over more than four decades, Scott has built a refereeing legacy that spans every level of the game - from school gyms in Alberta to the world stage. His international résumé includes Pan Am Games, NORCECA Championships, FIVB World League matches, and a long list of medal-round assignments that reflect both excellence and trust. In 2015, he made history as the first Canadian referee assigned to a Pan Am Games gold medal final.

But Scott's greatest contribution may be what happened between the matches: the moments spent coaching new officials, advocating for mentorship models, and quietly transforming how referees are supported across the country.




He chaired Volleyball Canada's National Referee Committee, where he championed new training frameworks that emphasized emotional regulation, mental focus, and long-term sustainability in officiating.

In Alberta, he has been a mentor, educator, and leader for decades - known not just for his rulebook knowledge, but for his fairness, humility, and unique ability to bring calm to high-pressure moments. His professional background in social work gave him an edge in communication, helping him guide referees not just in how to make calls, but how to handle conflict and grow through challenge.

Ken Briggs has dedicated his life to developing athletes, building programs, and shaping the culture of volleyball in Alberta. With a coaching career that spans over 40 years - from junior high to university, from club to Team Alberta, Ken has left an indelible mark at every level of the sport.

A graduate of the University of Alberta, Ken began his teaching and coaching career in Elk Island Public Schools, where he established a culture of excellence early on. At Salisbury Composite High School, he guided the women's program to three 4A Provincial Championships and six city titles - successes that foreshadowed an even greater impact to come.

Ken served as a Provincial Team coach for nearly two decades, including three Canada Games cycles that resulted in two bronze medals. His commitment to athlete development included international training tours and years mentoring within the Team Alberta system.

At the collegiate level, he led MacEwan University's women's volleyball program through its ACAC and U SPORTS transitions, becoming the program's first full-time head coach

Under his leadership, the Griffins captured the 2007 CCAA National Championship and Ken was named both Canada West and U SPORTS Coach of the Year in 2019-2020.

Beyond the wins, Ken is respected for his unwavering character. Humble, deeply ethical, and relentlessly dedicated to his student-athletes, Ken has built lasting relationships across generations. His players describe him as demanding yet deeply caring, and his peers regard him as a mentor in both volleyball and life.

Ken's influence also extended into governance - he served over three decades on the Volleyball Alberta Board of Directors in multiple leadership roles, including Vice President and Chair of the High Performance Committee. He helped initiate mentorship programs, advocate for coach development, and shape the future of the sport across the province.

Ken continues to give back to the game. His legacy is a tapestry of titles, talent, and above all, transformative leadership. Tonight, we recognize Ken Briggs not just for what he's achieved, but for how he's done it - with purpose, passion, and a profound commitment to the volleyball community.
